

Last Chance for Fall Garden Tasks!

We've had an amazing fall but late next week is calling for the white stuff! Use this weekend to finish the final clean up in your yard so you'll have much less to do next spring

WATER

The garden has not received significant moisture for weeks now, and plants will require one final deep soaking prior to heavy frost setting in. Set out sprinklers to ensure the lawn and surrounding plants receive one final watering

Large trees will benefit from a deep root watering with a **Ross Root Feeder**. The pronged device delivers water directly to the root zone.

RAKE

Leaves should be raked up from lawn and garden areas and composted or used to mulch tender plants. Leaves can also be dug into vegetable gardens for extra organic matter and nutrients. REMEMBER: If leaves are from plants that experienced insect or fungal problems, leaves should be thrown away and not used for any of the above.

CUT BACK

Hard stemmed perennials such as Daisies or Coneflower can be trimmed back to about 4" above ground. Soft stemmed plants such as Hosta will turn mushy with frost - prune this away as it can harbor insects and disease.

Ornamental grasses or plants with decorative seed heads can be left standing to help add winter interest to your yard, then pruned in spring.
