A VARIETY OF VEGGIES

With the spotlight still on growing your own produce, expect to see many new varieties of vegetables in both seeds and finished plants in 2012.



Trailblazer Onion

An early-season maturing yellow onion, Trailblazer outweighs any other variety when it comes to lengthy storage ability. Under proper conditions, Trailblazer can store until June. Its medium-sized bulbs are tight and firm, globe-shaped with thin necks. It resists botrytis and is slow to bolt – perfect in areas with heat stress such as ours.

Pepper Douce D' Espagne

This sweet pepper (also known as **Sweet Spanish Mammoth**) dates back to 1859. This is a sweet red pepper to measure others by. If eaten when green the taste is sweet and crisp, then once matured to red they are sweet and packed with flavour. Plants are robust and grow fairly tall (3-5 foot). Peppers are huge (20cm long) and the flesh is thick, crisp and juicy. A great all purpose pepper.



Rio Grande Tomato

Developed in Mexico. A vigorous bush variety forming meaty, pear shaped fruits which typically weigh 70-80g each. Perfect for cooking sauces and juicing. Can withstand hot days and cool nights, extreme temperature changes.
