

Unique Spring Bulbs to Start Indoors



Green Gloriosa Lily - Originally from Africa, Gloriosa lilies are beautiful, easy to grow, and will multiply. What more could you want! Easy to grow, this 'lily' will reach 4-5 feet, producing many lily-like flowers, of exceptional beauty. Though only hardy to Zone 8 this can easily be dug and stored or grown as a houseplant. Also available in a red coloured blossom.

Blood Lily (Scadoxus) - Related to the Amaryllis, blood lily is cherished for its powder puff blooms in shades of pink or red, followed by unique berries. One of the few flowering bulbs that will tolerate part shade.



Flowering Ginger 'Thai Supreme' (Curcuma) - Pink blooms resemble tulips, and appear in summer over a mound of thick leaves. Be sure to plant in well drained soil; add a handful of sand to potting mix to ensure good drainage. Can be stored over winter or kept in pot and overwintered as a houseplant.

Nerine 'Kodora' - The common Nerine sports pink blossoms but this new selection has bright red blooms that attract hummingbirds and butterflies. A great container choice; Nerine loves to be crowded so avoid potting up into too large of a container.



Pair of Giraffes Dahlia - This unusual Dahlia has spidery blossoms in a mix of colours that resemble lily blooms. Distinctive spots add another unique touch.

Pineapple Lily (Eucomis) - This African native has beautiful tropical leaves beneath an unusual spike of flowers resembling a pineapple. Available in cream and pink, this makes a fantastic container plant. Can be lifted and stored from year to year.
